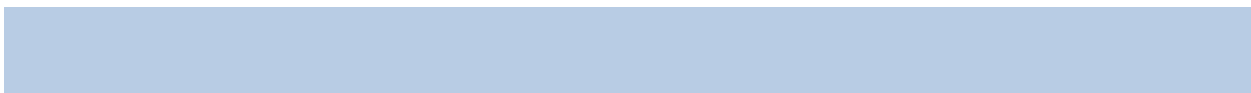

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DEPARTMENT OF TEACHER EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Admission to education major and teacher certification requires the following:

- Successful completion of all sections of the MoGEA Exam by 64 credit hours of college-level coursework or have an ACT composite score of 20 or greater. Transfer students who choose to take the MoGEA exam must pass all sections during the first semester following transfer to Webster University.
- Written Program of Study (POS) outlining the degree and program requirements developed upon transfer to Webster (or by completion of 64 credit hours)
- Completion of a college composition course with a grade of B- or better
- Completion of a college mathematics course (appropriate to the area of emphasis) with a grade of B- or better
