**DEPARTMENT OF TEACHER EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

Admission to education major and teacher certification requires the following:

- Successful completion of all sections of the MoGEA Exam by 64 credit hours of college-level coursework *or* have an ACT composite score of 20 or greater. Transfer students who choose to take the MoGEA exam must pass all sections during the first semester following transfer to Webster University.
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- Completion of a college mathematics course (appropriate to the area of emphasis) with a grade of B- or better
- Completion of EDUC 2800 with a grade of B or better
- Completion of EDUC 2000 with a grade of B or better
- A completed Candidate at Bpm 0 Tw 9.435 0 Td0
